The questions, the answers, and even the arguments all have to do with one important thing --principles. We may argue about who did what in the last election, but we don't research which marketer gives the best "bang for the buck" so we can lobby voters to do what we want them to do, etc. We argue about which approaches make it possible for our communities to thrive in the long term. We want to know how the US changed from a country of independent, hardworking folks with a flourishing economy that was the envy of the world to a country of people who want government to do everything for them, a country that is sliding into economic decline. We want to return to the smaller government that left the country free to prosper, where children could see a bright future in front of them, not a jail cell. Where they can get a second chance from a life mistake, and not have to wonder if they will ever be able to have a rewarding job and a life to be proud of.

Our candidates have their share of debates, and they can be quite feisty, but they are usually struggling to find a path to bring government back to the boundaries it was limited to by the
